

Get to know your computer

Appearance

| 1 | Camera | Can be used to take photos or make video chats. |
| 2 | Camera indicator | Indicates the camera's status. Lights up steady white when the camera is active. |
| 3 | Microphone | Use the microphone to conduct video meetings, voice calls, or make audio recordings. |
| 4 | Display | Displays the computer desktop. |
| 5 | Fingerprint power button | After enrolling a fingerprint, simply press the power button with the enrolled finger to power on and unlock the computer without having to enter a password. |
| 6 | HONOR Magic-link icon | Tap the NFC detection area on some Honor phones against the HONOR Magic-link icon on the computer to use the HONOR Magic-link feature. i Do not tear off or damage HONOR Magic-link icon as it may cause HONOR Magic-link to stop working properly. |
| 7 | Touchpad | Provides similar functionality to a mouse. A convenient way to control the computer. |

Powering on and off

When powering on the computer for the first time, connect the power adapter, and the computer will power on automatically. The computer will enter the startup screen shortly after the screen lights up.

When the computer is powered off, press the Power button until the screen or keyboard lights up to power on or wake the computer.

When using the computer, click \blacksquare > \bigcirc to sleep, shut down, or restart the computer.


A Press and hold the power button for approximately 10 seconds to force shutdown the computer. Force shutdowns may cause unsaved data to be lost. Use with caution.

Charging the computer

The computer will display a prompt when the battery is running low. If you see this prompt, charge your computer as soon as possible or it will affect your normal use.

Charging the computer with a power adapter

The computer features a non-removable rechargeable battery. Connect the power adapter and charging cable to charge the computer. The battery charges more quickly when the computer is powered off or in Sleep mode.



Safety information

- Charge the computer at room temperature in a well-ventilated, shaded area. Charging the computer in hot environments may damage the internal components.
- $\cdot\,$ Charging duration may vary based on the ambient temperature and battery use.
- It is normal for the computer to become warm after prolonged use or charging. If it becomes hot to the touch, disable non-essential features and disconnect the charger.

Get to know your computer

• The battery is subject to wear over time. If the computer's standby time appears to have fallen, do not attempt to replace the battery by yourself. Instead, take the computer and proof of purchase to an authorized Honor Customer Service Center for assistance.

Keyboard

Keyboard keys may vary depending on your device model.

Shortcut keys

Press the Fn key, the indicator lights up, which means the F keys, such as F1 and F2, are now in shortcut (hotkey) mode to perform common actions.

Switching between shortcut and function key modes

In function key mode, the F keys have different functions depending on the software that is running.

To use the F keys as function keys, you can:

- Press the Fn key and the indicator will light up. The F keys, such as F1 and F2, will then work as shortcuts (hotkeys). To return to function key mode, press the Fn key then the indicator will turn off.
- Press Fn+r keys to switch the screen refresh rate.
- To make the F keys work as function keys by default, go to Settings > System in HONOR PC Manager and enable "Prioritize functions". To switch back to the shortcut key mode, enable "Prioritize hotkeys".




Touchpad

The touchpad provides similar functionality to a mouse and is a convenient way to control the computer.

Modify touchpad settings

You can modify touchpad settings to suit your own preferences.

- 1 Click **III** > **O** to open Settings.
- 2 On the Settings screen, click **Bluetooth & devices** > **Touchpad** to:
- Enable or disable the touchpad.
- · Automatically enable or disable the touchpad when a mouse is connected.
- Change the touchpad scroll direction.
- Configure touchpad gestures.

Getting started

Step 1: Connecting to a network

Click in the lower right corner of the desktop. Select a Wi-Fi network and follow the instructions to establish a connection.



Step 2: Activating Windows

Windows will activate automatically when you connect to the Internet for the first time.


Click Settings > System > Activation to check if Windows has been activated. If Windows cannot be activated, restart the computer, connect to the network, and try again. If the issue persists, connect to a different network or wait a while before trying again.

i If Windows is not activated, some features on your computer may be restricted.

Step 3: Enrolling a fingerprint

If you skipped the fingerprint enrollment process during the initial setup, click **Settings** > **Accounts** > **Sign-in options** > **Fingerprint recognition**. In the Sign-in option, set the Sign-in password first and then follow the instructions to entroll your fingerprint.

- Ensure that your fingertips are clean and dry, or your fingerprint may not be enrolled correctly.
 - Each user can enroll up to 10 fingerprints.



Step 4: Updating the drivers

You can manage drivers in HONOR PC Manager. If driver updates are available, follow the instructions to complete the updates.

Check and update your drivers regularly to improve the stability and performance of the computer.

Highlighted features

HONOR Device Clone

Device Clone with no worries.

By using **HONOR Device Clone**, it only takes a short time to transfer images, videos, and other files from the old computer to the new HONOR PC. The personal files of the old computer and HONOR PC can be seamlessly connected.

i Only support old computer with Windows 7/10/11 systems.

Transfer data from a non-HONOR device

- 1 On the old computer and HONOR PC, enable **Bluetooth** and **Wi-Fi**, and connect the computers to the same network.
- 2 On HONOR PC, enable HONOR PC Manager, click Home > Device Clone > This is the new device.
- **3** On the old computer, download and install **HONOR Device Clone**.
- **4** On the old computer, enter the **HONOR Device Clone** app. Confirm that the connection codes are the same following the on-screen instructions. Establish a connection between the old computer and the HONOR PC.
- **5** On HONOR PC, select the data to be transferred, click **Start** to complete data cloning.

Transfer data from an HONOR device

- 1 On the old computer and HONOR PC, enable **Bluetooth** and **Wi-Fi**.
- 2 On the HONOR PC, enable HONOR PC Manager, and click Home > Device Clone > This is the new device.
- **3** On the old computer, enable **HONOR PC Manager**, and click **Home** > **Device Clone** > **This is the old device**.
 - i If the old computer does not have HONOR PC Manager, install the HONOR Device Clone

app on the old computer following the on-screen instructions.

- **4** Confirm that the connection codes are the same following the on-screen instructions on the old computer. Establish a connection between the old computer and the HONOR PC.
- **5** Select the data to be transferred on HONOR PC. Click **Start** to complete data cloning.

Phone Collaboration

Connect your PC and phone

Connect your PC and phone to improve work efficiency by using the keyboard and mouse to control your phone on your laptop to share and edit files across systems.

Connect your PC and phone with OneHop:

- 1 Make sure that the computer supports the HONOR Share sensor or has the sensor label
- **2** On the computer, turn on Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, and **HONOR PC Manager**, and agree to the User License Agreement.
- **3** Turn on NFC on the phone.
- 4 Place the NFC area on the phone against the HONOR Share sensor or the label on the computer until a prompt tone or vibration is received. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the connection.

Connect your PC and phone with a cable

- 1 Connect your PC and phone with a USB cable.
- 2 On the computer, open HONOR PC Manager, go to Multi-Screen Collaboration > Phone > Other ways to connect.
- **3** Follow the pop-up box on your phone to complete the connection.

Disconnect your PC and phone

After the work is done, you can use the following methods to disconnect the devices:

- On your PC, enable HONOR PC Manager and click Disconnect.
- Swipe down from the status bar at the top of your screen to open the notification panel and tap **DISCONNECT**.
- If your PC and phone are connected with a USB cable, remove the cable between your PC and phone to disconnect.

Transfer and edit files between your PC and phone

Once the phone is connected to your PC, you can use the mouse in the phone window on the computer to directly drag and drop files to your PC to use or edit.

Transfer files from the phone to your PC:

- In the mirrored phone window on your PC, open **Gallery** or **Files**, and long press to select images, videos, or other files. When the drag icon appears, drag them to the PC.
- In the mirrored phone window on your PC, select images or text and drag them to the document being edited on the computer.

For example, you can drag a photo from your phone or text from the Notepad app to a Microsoft Office document you are editing on your computer.

Transfer files from PC to phone:

- Drag images and videos from the PC to **Gallery** in the mirrored phone window on the computer.
- Drag documents from the PC to **Files** in the mirrored phone window on the computer.
- Drag images and text from the PC to a document being edited on the phone through the mirrored window on the computer.

For example, you can drag an image from the computer to a note in the Notepad app being edited on your phone.

Edit files:

Drag text, images, audio, and video files from your phone or PC to an app or document for quick editing.

For example, you can select an image on the phone with the mouse, then long click and drag it to the PowerPoint presentation on the computer.

Open multiple phone apps on the computer

When the phone is connected to your PC, you can open 3 phone app windows at maximum on the computer.

In the mirrored phone window on the laptop, open an app, and click + on the mirrored window to open a window for the app on the laptop. You can continue to open other apps on your phone. Each window is used independently and does not affect the other.

i Depending on your device, you may be able to open 2 or 3 phone windows simultaneously.

Answering video calls on PC

When the phone is connected to your PC, you can answer video calls (such as WeChat and QQ) on the laptop. During the call, audio and video are recorded and played through the laptop or the speaker or camera connected to it.

During the call, swipe down from the status bar to open the notification panel and tap PLAY AUDIO/VIDEO ON PHONE/PLAY AUDIO/VIDEO ON PC to change the player.

PC Collaboration with Tablet/Foldable Phone

Tablet collaboration, connects PC and tablet/ foldable phone to expand and complement the screen capabilities and improve work efficiency by using stylus.

Connect PC to tablet/foldable phone

- 1 Make sure **Wi-Fi** and **Bluetooth** are enabled on the computer and the tablet/foldable phone. When connecting, please make sure that the tablet/foldable phone is on, and the foldable phone is unfolded.
- 2 On the desktop, open HONOR PC Manager, and click Multi-Screen Collaboration > Tablet Collaboration.

You can click 2 > **Tablet Collaboration** at the bottom-right conor of the desktop on the taskbar and follow on-screen instructions to connect the PC and the tablet/foldable phone.

3 Select a tablet/foldable phone on the device list, click **Connect**, and follow the on-screen instructions to complete the connection.

When successfully connected, on the **Tablet Collaboration** interface, you can switch between **Mirror**, **Extend** and **Share** mode. In addition, the audio channel can be changed.

Only some HONOR tablet and foldable phones support this feature. Please refer to the actual usage. When the screen is locked and off, the device cannot be found.

Mirror mode

When the PC is connected, on the **Tablet Collaboration** interface, you can select the **Mirror** mode.

In the **Mirror** mode, the home screen of the tablet/foldable phone is projected to the computer desktop in a similar layout.

For example, when the tablet synchronously displays the computer screen, computer files can be edited and saved with a stylus pen on the tablet.

Extend mode

When the computer is connected, on the **Tablet Collaboration** interface, you can select the **Extend** mode.

The home screen of the tablet/foldable phone is projected to the left or right side of the computer desktop in the layout of extended display. Click **Extend** > **Display Settings**, and select the relative position and sidebar location between the computer and the tablet/ foldable phone.

In the **Extend** mode, use the tablet/foldable phone as the secondary screen. Open an app on the computer, dragging it with a mouse should be displayed on the tablet/foldable phone, and others will be displayed on the computer screen.

For example, you can participate in video conferences on your tablet/foldable phone while editing PPTs on your computer.

Share mode

When the computer is connected, on the **Tablet Collaboration** interface, you can select the **Share** mode,

click **Share** > **Display Settings**, and select the relative position between the PC and the tablet/foldable phone to your preference.

In the **Share** mode, you can operate the PC and the tablet/foldable phone simultaneously with the keyboard and mouse, and drag and edit images, videos, documents, and other files between the two devices.

For example, you can use your keyboard to edit documents on the tablet/foldable phone.

Please update your HONOR tablet/ foldable phone to Magic UI 6.0 and later. This feature may vary depending on your device.

Exit Tablet Collaboration

When projected, disconnect with the following methods:

- Go to Tablet Collaboration > Disconnect, exit Tablet Collaboration.
- Click > **Tablet Collaboration** at the bottom-right corner of the desktop on the taskbar and follow on-screen instructions to exit Tablet Collaboration.
- Swipe down from the status bar at the top of the tablet screen to open the notification panel and tap to exit Tablet Collaboration.
- In the Mirror/Extend mode, you can also click \bigcirc on the sidebar of the tablet/foldable phone and follow on-screen instructions to exit Tablet Collaboration.

TV Collaboration

Through wireless connection, you can connect your laptop to a larger display (such as HONOR Vision) for business and entertainment, or PC content on the TV.

Connect the PC and TV

- On the PC and TV, turn on Wi-Fi and Bluetooth and connect them to the network.
 i If the TV only supports Lebocast protocol or Cast+ 2.0 and below, connect both devices to the same LAN. This feature requires the Internet for the first-time connection.
- 2 On the desktop of your PC, open HONOR PC Manager, and click Multi-Screen Collaboration > TV Collaboration.

You can also go to the bottom-right corner of the computer desktop and click **2** > **TV Collaboration**. Then follow the instructions to connect your PC and TV.

3 Select the name of your TV or wireless projector in the device list, click **Connect**, and follow instructions to complete the screen projection.

After the devices are connected, in the **TV Collaboration** interface, you can switch between **Mirror** and **Extend** mode. In addition, the audio channel can be changed.

i For the first-time connection, **Mirror** is selected by default. Otherwise, the previous connection mode will be used.

Mirror mode

A

After the screen projection is completed, in the **TV Collaboration** interface, you can select the **Mirror** mode. In the **Mirror** mode, the screens of the PC and TV are synchronized. The PC screen is projected to the TV screen in a similar layout. The same content is displayed on the TV and PC.

For example, the image of videos or video meetings on the PC can be projected to the TV display for a better view.

Extend mode

After the screen projection is completed, in the **TV Collaboration** interface, you can select the **Extend** mode. In the **Extend** mode, you can use the mouse to control both screens simultaneously, with the TV screen treated as the secondary screen. For example, you can open an application on the primary display (PC) and drag it to the TV. All other PC content will still be displayed on the PC screen.

Go to **Extend** mode > **Display settings** > **Multi-display** and arrange the relative positions of the displays according to your need.

In this mode, you can edit images on the TV while working with PowerPoint slides.

Exit TV Collaboration

- After the screen projection is completed, in the TV Collaboration interface, you can click
 Disconnect to exit TV Collaboration.
- Or you can go to the bottom-right corner of the computer desktop and click 🔯 on the taskbar. Then follow instructions to exit **TV Collaboration**.

HONOR Share

Use HONOR Share to share files fast

HONOR Share is a technology for fast wireless transfers of images, videos, documents, and other files between devices. It uses Bluetooth to discover other HONOR Share-enabled devices in the vicinity and then transfers files via a direct Wi-Fi connection. No mobile data is required during the transfer process.

Enable HONOR Share

Enable HONOR Share in any of the ways below:

• On the PC: Open HONOR PC Manager, select HONOR Share, and make sure **Discoverable to other devices** is turned on.

Or you can click 2 > HONOR Share on the taskbar.

• **On the phone:** Swipe down from the status bar to access the notification panel (continue swiping down to display more content), long-press HONOR Share to enter the settings interface, and turn on **HONOR Share**.

Transfer files between computers using HONOR Share

With **HONOR Share**, you can transfer documents, photos, videos, and other files to multiple nearby HONOR computers in a wireless way.

- 1 On the PCs receiving the file, enable **HONOR Share** and make sure **Discoverable to other devices** is turned on.
- **2** Go to the PC with the file and send it in either of the ways below:

- Open **HONOR PC Manager** on the desktop, select **HONOR Share** and drag the selected file to the icons of other devices.
- Right-click the file to be shared, select **HONOR Share** to receive the file from the device list.
- **3** Click **Accept** on the other PC to start the transfer.

Go to **HONOR PC Manager** > **HONOR Share** > **Open received files** on the devices receiving the file to see the received files.

Share files between the PC and phone using HONOR Share

Share, view, and edit files between your computer and your HONOR phone without the need for a data cable.

From PC to phone:

- 1 Enable **Bluetooth** on the phone and PC.
- 2 Go to HONOR PC Manager > HONOR Share on the PC and make sure Discoverable to other devices is turned on.
- **3** Go to the phone, swipe down from the status bar to access the notification panel (continue swiping down to display more content), long-press **HONOR Share** to enter the settings interface, and turn on **HONOR Share**.
- 4 Select the file to be sent on the PC, right-click with the mouse and go to **Show more** options > HONOR Share. The computer will search for phones that have HONOR Share enabled. Select the phone to receive the file.
 - You can also open HONOR PC Manager on the PC, select HONOR Share and drag the selected file to the icons of other devices.
- **5** Follow on-screen prompts to receive the file on the phone.

From phone to PC:

- 1 Enable **Bluetooth** on the phone and PC.
- **2** Go to the phone, swipe down from the status bar to access the notification panel (continue swiping down to display more content), long-press **HONOR Share** to enter the settings interface, and turn on **HONOR Share**.
- **3** Go to **HONOR PC Manager** > **HONOR Share** on the PC and make sure **Discoverable to other devices** is turned on.
- **4** Long press the file to be shared on your phone, tap 2 >HONOR Share, select the name of the PC and receive the file on that PC.
- **5** Follow on-screen instructions to receive the file on the PC.

Please update HONOR PC Manager to the latest version.

More Tips

Touch the power button to unlock with fingerprint ID

If the PC is locked, touch the power button with your enrolled finger to unlock the PC.

- 1 On the taskbar, click the Windows Key > Settings > Accounts > Sign-in options > FingerPrint recognition(windows hello) to verify or set the account password and PIN.
- **2** Follow the on-screen prompts to enroll your fingerprint on the power button.

i The location of the fingerprint sensor varies by model.

Copy text in the image

Recognize text in images with one click. Copy, edit the text, and perform other operations without having to type.

Method 1:

- 1 Left-click HONOR PC Manager on the taskbar.
- 2 Click $\[\]$ After the screen is captured, the text recognition result appears to the right of the image.
- **3** In the text recognition result box, select the desired text and press CTRL + C to copy the text.

Method 2:

Open an existing image using the image viewer and perform text recognition.

Place the phone on the computer to record the computer screen

After the phone is connected to the computer, place the phone on the computer to project and record games, videos, and other contents displayed on the computer screen.

1 After the phone is connected to the computer, touch the NFC area on the back of the

phone against the HONOR Share sensor on the computer or the *market* label until you hear the prompt tone or vibration to project and record the computer screen.

- 2 Tap on the phone to stop the recording. The recording is automatically saved to the Gallery on your phone.
- *i* This feature works for computers empowered by Intel processors only.

Care for your eyes with the Eye Comfort mode

It is darker at night. If you need to continue working or studying for a long time, you can turn on the Eye Comfort mode to effectively reduce blue light radiation and adjust the screen to a warmer tone to protect your eyes.

Right-click on the desktop, go to **Show More Options** > **Display Manager**, and turn on or off the **Eye Comfort** mode.

- After turning on the Eye Comfort mode, the screen will become a little yellowish. This is normal.
 - If you uninstall HONOR PC Manager, you will not be able to use this feature.

Enjoy high performance in the Performance mode

We added the Performance mode to deliver the best performance to you. Performance mode can upscale the performance of the device. When it is enabled, the computer may have an increase in fan sound, higher heat, and a decrease in battery power in certain high power consumption scenarios, which is normal.

Keep the PC connected to a power source and the battery above 20%. Turn on/off the Performance mode in any of the ways below:

Method 1:Press the Fn key, press Fn + P until \bigcirc appears on the desktop. Then the Performance mode is turned on.

Method 2: Open HONOR PC Manager on the desktop and click System optimisation >

Power management. If *C* appears on the desktop, then the Performance mode is turned on.

After you have turned on the Performance mode, it will be turned off automatically when you disconnect the power supply, when the battery is below 20%, and the computer is put on standby, sleep, or restart. If you need to enable this mode, please turn it on again using the same method described above.

Restore your PC to the factory settings

If your computer stops working correctly, you can use the built-in **F10** system-restore function to restore your computer system to its initial state in a short time and protect your important files.

When turning on the computer, long-press or click the **F10** key to enter the system-restore wizard and follow the on-screen instructions to restore the factory settings.


Restoring the system will delete the data in the C drive (including personal data on the desktop, and in Downloads and Files). Please back up important files in advance.

Click 🚺 to open the Start menu.



- Click 🔍 to change, lock, or sign out of the current user account.
- \cdot Click to sleep, shut down, or restart the computer.
- • is the search area: enter the content to be searched here.
- 2 is the application area: drag up and down to see all applications and programs.
- is the recent files area: shows recently opened files and new applications.

Action center

In the action center, you can quickly turn on or off features or change the settings.

Press **Win+a** to open the action center. You can then:

- Quickly open Settings, projection options, and more.
- Quickly access frequently used settings (such as Battery saver, Flight mode, screen brightness, and more).


Accessories and extensions

Bluetooth mouse (optional)

The Honor Bluetooth mouse connects to the computer wirelessly via Bluetooth. To start using the Bluetooth mouse, you must first pair it with the computer.

Getting to know the Bluetooth mouse

i The Bluetooth mouse is an optional accessory and is sold separately.





Install the battery

As illustrated below, remove the battery cover from the mark located at the bottom end of the mouse. Insert one AA battery, making sure to match the + and - signs in the battery compartment. Close the cover.



Pairing the Bluetooth mouse with the computer



- 1 Toggle the Bluetooth pairing switch at the bottom of the mouse to 3 for approximately 3 seconds. Once the indicator starts blinking, the Bluetooth mouse is ready to pair.
- 2 On your computer, click **III** > **۞** > **Bluetooth & devices**, click **Add device** to add Bluetooth devices, and choose HONOR Mouse in the Bluetooth device list. Allow a few moments for pairing to complete.
